- 1. This argument could be made better by including less enthusiastic Republican voters and voters from outside of the libertarian candidate's home state. The conclusion is about Republican voters in general, but most of the people who voted in the mock election were political junkie, and a bunch of people from the candidates home state. An unbiased sample of Republican voters would include people from all around the country and Republicans who are less enthusiastic about politics.
- 2. This argument could be made better by including other demographics, specifically woman. The conclusions is about people generally, but the only people in the study are men. An unbiased sample of people would also make sure to include woman.
- 3. This argument could be improved if it surveyed people who did not buy Nestlé's soup. The conclusions is about everybody, but the argument is only about people who already like it and bought it. A representative example would make sure to include people who did not go out and buy the product, we already know that most of these people like it.
- 1. We need to know how many thefts they prevented, or the number of cars stolen in past.
- 2. We need to know at what rate do children die from measles who do not get the vaccine.
- 3. We need to know a few things in this argument. How many people miss behave on day time flights? How many other passengers were well behaved? What was the rate of poorly behaved passengers during their grandparents age?
- 1. This argument give two statistics to help the conclusions that the rich fared better than the poor after the Egyptian revolution. However, these statistics are misleading because it is not clear how the rates have changes. First, the number of billions has doubled, but what was it before, maybe it went from one to two. Second, the average income per person rose by twenty percent, but that does not specify how the poor did. The average per person could have risen because of the billionaires, and everyone else could have done worse, or the average could have gone up because they really took care of their poor and the average citizen did not change. We would need more background information do make this a better argument.
- 2. This argument uses one extreme statistic to conclude that lift ticket scams are everywhere. But this statistic is misleading because it is not clear how many fake passes were sold before, moreover it is not clear how many fake passes were sold in 2017. Just because it jumped up over 800% does not mean that it is a problem for visitors to worry about. It might have gone from one to eight hundred and seventy five. Furthermore, it is less clear that from this one example that we can conclude that fake passes are everywhere. For all we know Vail might have a bad problem with counterfeit passes. We would need to know the number behind the percentages, and how frequent it is in other ski towns.
- 3. This argument uses two statistics to conclude that woman are not treated equally in the Israeli military. However these statistics are misleading because we do not have anything to

compare it to. The fact that ninety-two percent of jobs in the Israeli military are open to woman is encouraging, but it is not clear how many opportunities are open for woman in other countries. We would also need to know what percentage of those militaries have woman serving in combat roles. Furthermore, just because only three percent of woman serve in combat roles for the Israeli military does not clearly support the conclusions, we would need to know more about the selection process. Maybe woman are being discriminated against, or maybe woman are self-selecting non-combat duties. We would need to have some more points of comparison, and we would need to know more about the selection process to conclude that the Israeli military is not treat woman equally.
